**Learning objectives**

The proposed online learning program aims to create an initial appreciation of good governance and social accountability concepts and tools, and how these relate to OGB EA's governance work in the region.

The program shall have the following specific objectives:

1. Deepen participants' appreciation of how accountable and effective governments contribute to the attainment of their programs' vision and goals;
2. Establish a practical understanding of the social accountability framework and tools, and how these can be applied in the participants' work;
3. Develop appropriate social accountability strategies and approaches that the participants can implement under their respective programs.
